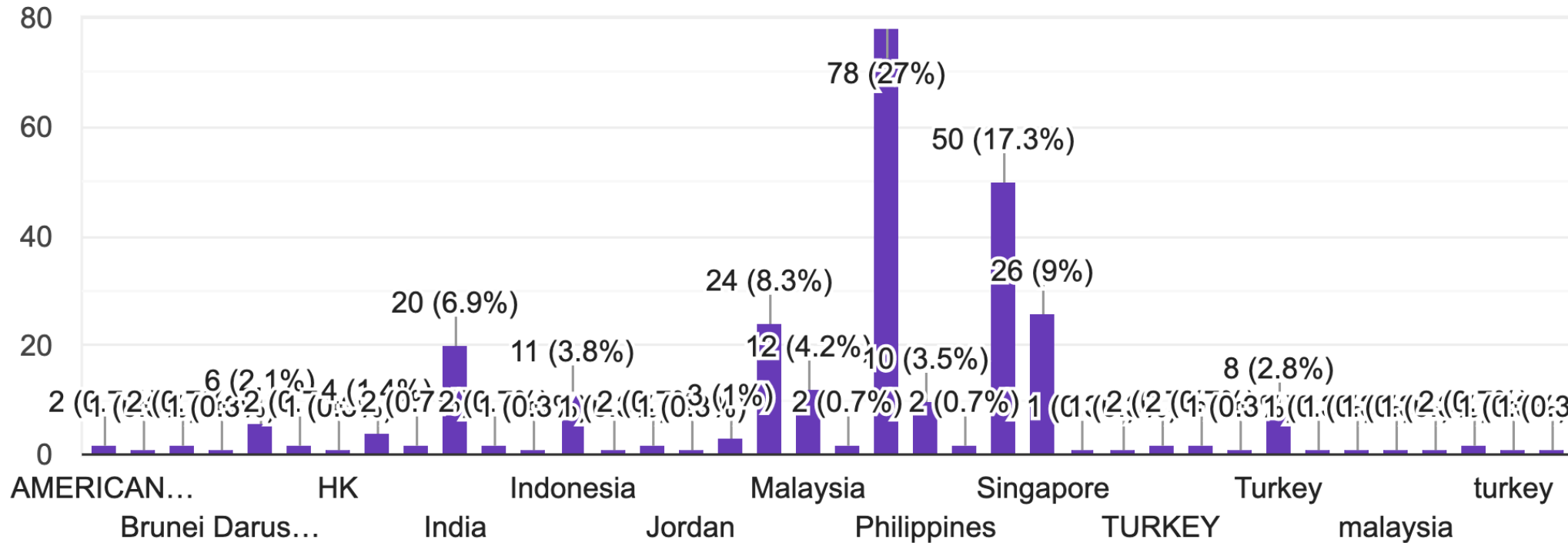

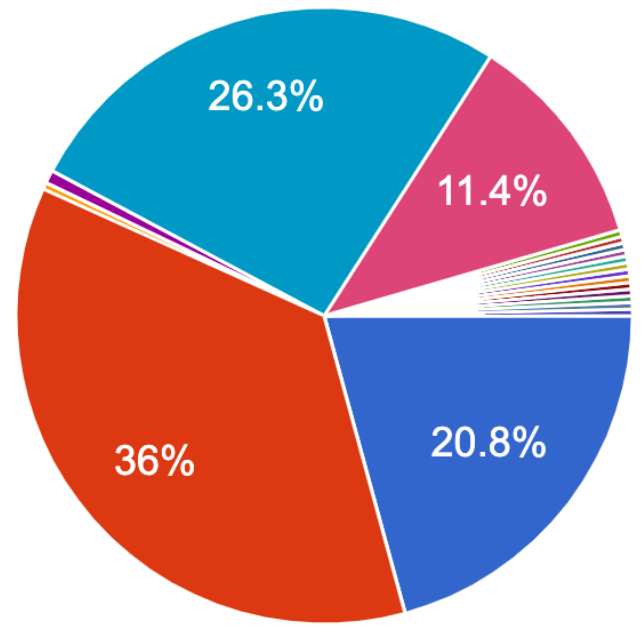
Country distribution of survey respondents

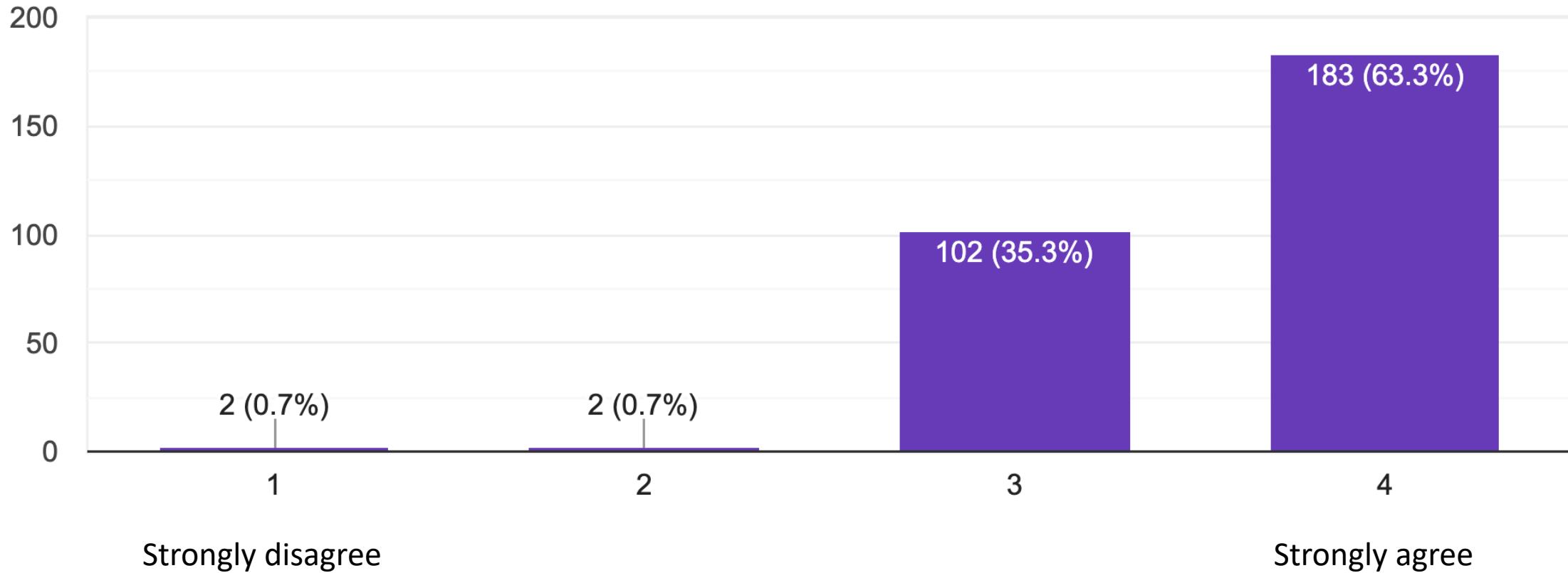

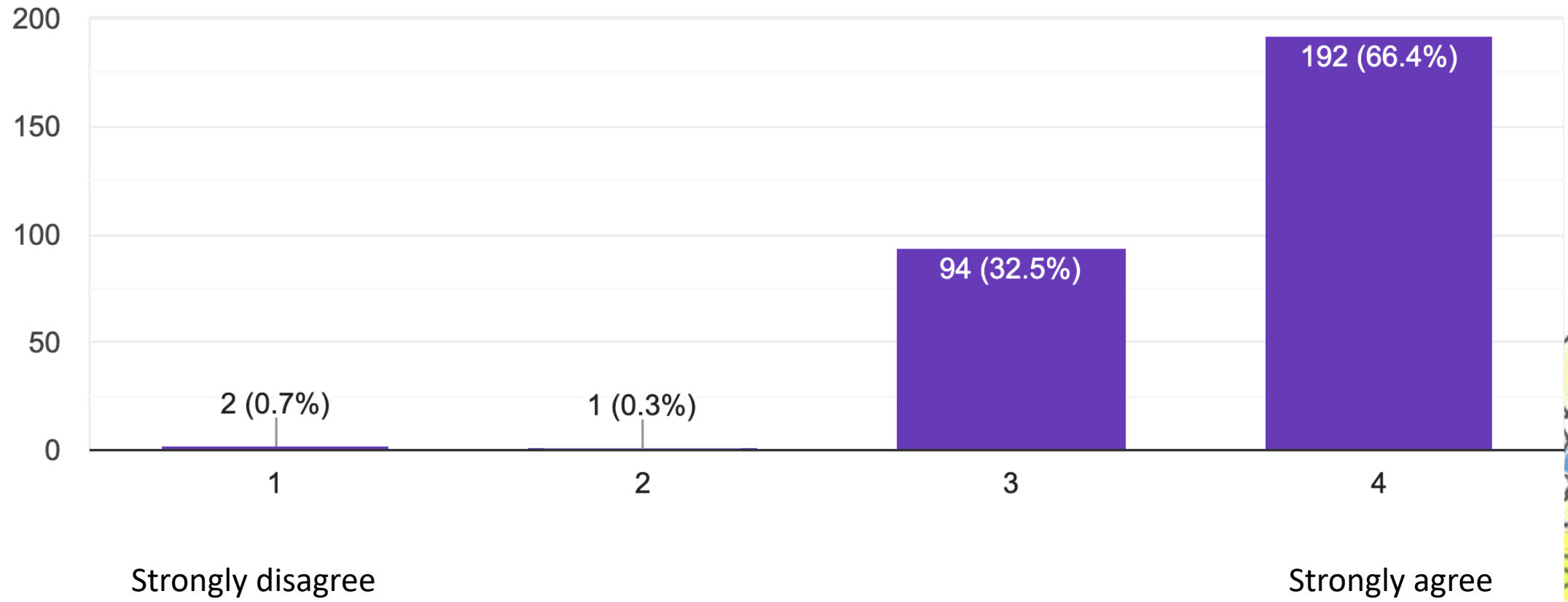

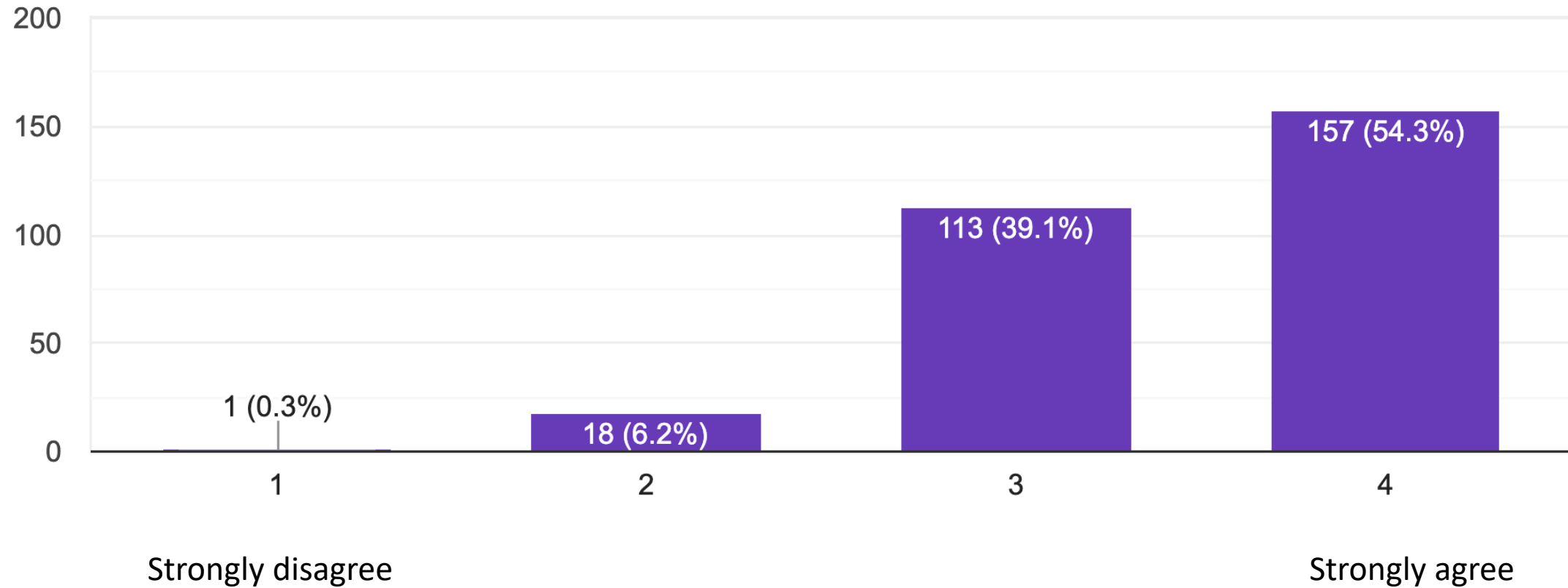

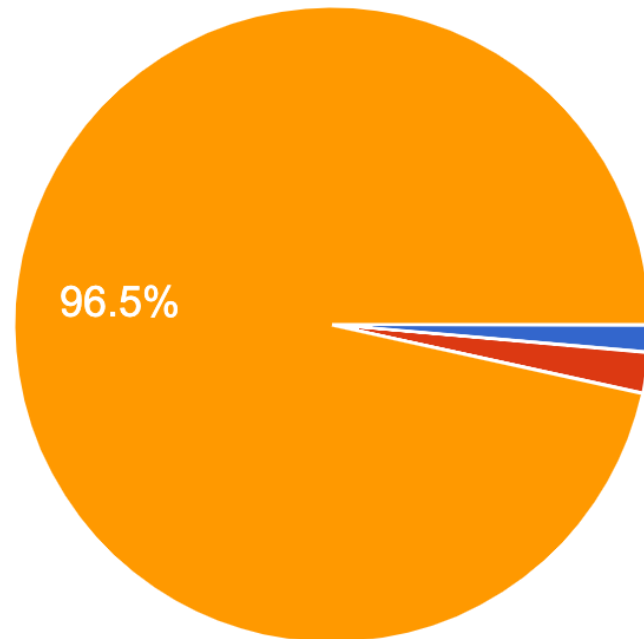
