### Introduction

The 5<sup>th</sup> webinar focus on paediatric sedation. Paediatric sedation is practiced by a lot of clinician from different disciplines, including paediatrician, emergency physician, intensivist, dentist and so on, and anaesthesiologist often takes up the role as advocate and leader of safe sedation service. In this webinar, we have a panel of four paediatric anaesthesiologist with passion and dedication to improve paediatric sedation.

### Moderators:

This webinar was led and moderated by Dr Vivian Yuen form the Hong Kong Children’s Hospital. Dr Evangeline Lim from the KK Women’s and Children’s Hospital is the co-moderator.

### Speakers and topics:

Dr Agnes Ng spoke on “The path to safe sedation – getting all on board”. In this talk she share her experience on leading the sedation committee at the KK Women’s and Children’s Hospital. Her sharing and experience were invaluable for participants to take reference should they need to

Dr Keira Mason spoke on “TCI in paediatric sedation”. In this talk she gave us a brief overview of Target control infusion in paediatric patients and shared with us the practical tips on using TCI in children for sedation.

Dr Angela Yeo talked on “Sedoanalgesia and Weaning in the Children's ICU”. In this talk she gave us up-to-date overview on use of sedatives in critically ill children.

Dr Vansie Kwok presented “Challenging Case in Paediatric Sedation”. She shared the challenges and management of a patient with Mucopolysaccharidosis type IV requiring repeated MRI studies. Polling was used in this talk and we received a lot of positive comment regarding polling.

### Practice sessions:

Two practice sessions were taken place. The practice allowed all speakers, moderators and technical support to meet and worked on the logistic of the webinar. Moreover, we also ensured that there were no overlaps on the content of each talks.
